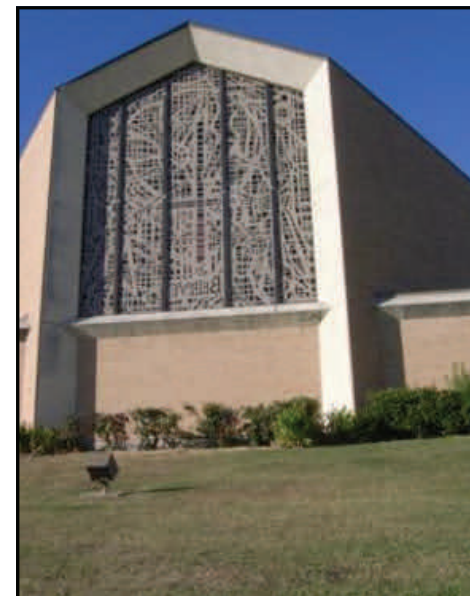

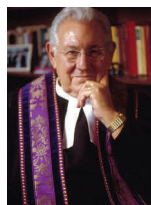

Rev. Dr. Fred Anderson, Sr. Pastor, Emeritus, MAPC*. First a musician with a professional singing career, a tour in the USAF was followed by M.Div. & D.Min degrees from Princeton Seminary where he is now a trustee. Noted pastor/scholar, he has numerous published articles on theology, preaching, hymnody and worship. His hymns and metrical psalm texts appear in U.S., Canadian, Asian hymnals. His new Psalter will appear in summer, 2016. He chairs the board of the Center for Theological Inquiry, and is trustee of the Appeal of Conscience Foundation, an interfaith group dedicated to furtherance of human rights, religious freedom, and tolerance.



Dr. Christopher Aspaas is Dir. of Choral Activities and Assoc. Prof. of Music at Texas Christian University. He recently came from St. Olaf College where he held the Scholz Endowed Chair in Music and conducted the 90-voice Viking Chorus. His degrees are from St. Olaf, Michigan State, and a Ph.D. from Florida State. He has recently conducted Requiems of Brahms, Mendelssohn and Mozart, and his performance of Britten's War Requiem was featured on Minnesota Public Radio. He is a frequent clinician and workshop leader, and will lead the ACDA Southern Division Men's Honor Choir in 2016. He is also active as a tenor soloist.

PRESENTERS



Sam Eatherton is Minister of Music at Zion Lutheran Church in Dallas where he directs adult and handbell choirs, chamber ensemble, and teaches grades 3-8 music. His compositions are with Concordia Publishing, including 3 organ volumes, and has received the Richard Hillert Award in Composition from Concordia University-Chicago. He is a frequent workshop contributor and hymn festival director.



Doug Haney has been Minister of Music at Wilshire Baptist since 2004. He directs the choral program, oversees the church-wide music ministry, and has primary responsibility for worship. Under his leadership Wilshire's 100 voice choir has recorded 3 CDs and the 80 voice youth choir makes annual mission tours. He holds degrees from Georgia State and Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary.

Dr. Andrew Henderson, Dir. of Music and Organist, MAPC*, provides oversight for 45 voice St. Andrew Chorale, NYC Children's Chorus, Music on Madison concerts. He is Assoc. Organist for Temple Emanuel and teaches at Columbia University and Manhattan School of Music. With degrees from Cambridge, Yale, and Juilliard, he is a prize winner in international organ competitions, has been featured on *Pipedreams*, *With Heart and Voice*, and with the NY Philharmonic, American Symphony Orchestra.

Rev. Dr. Robert Preece has been Sr. Pastor at Zion Lutheran Church since 1990 where he oversees an active congregation and school. He is a graduate of Concordia Seminary and Drew University. He leads mission trips to international sites and organizes relief work for local disasters and urban needs. Pastor Preece led capital campaigns to improve facilities, reconstruct parking areas, and add a Minister of Youth and Parish Education. The parish is now adding school classrooms, a larger gym, office and music facilities, and re-purposing other space for ministry.
